

CERTIFICATES OF NO ACCIDENT FOR PILOTS

With reference to enquiries that AAIIB receives from pilots requiring to submit to airlines a certificate that they have not been involved in any civil aviation accident or serious incident, AAIIB wishes to state the following:

Law under ICAO Annex 13, Regulation (EU) n ° 996/2010 and Law 73/I/2015 , protects the information gathered by the Safety Investigation Authorities. Therefore, as per this legislation, this information must be exclusively used by the Safety Investigation Authorities for the only purpose to prevent future accidents and improve safety, and not releasing that information to third parties for purposes other than using it during the investigation.

Giving consideration to the above, the final reports of the Safety Investigation Authorities do not include any personal details. Checking information gathered by the Safety Investigation Authority to verify if a pilot is included therein to satisfy this kind of enquiries would imply an inappropriate use.

What is a certificate of no accidents?

Aircraft operators from different countries require pilots, to submit a certificate from their aviation authority in which it is confirmed that they haven't been involved in any accident or serious incident.

AAIIB cannot issue a certificate of no accidents?

According to the Cyprus and international laws, AAIIB cannot use information collected during investigations for purposes other than accident prevention and safety improvement.

This information is considered confidential, personal and its publication to third parties is protected by law.

AAIIB considers that the use of this information for purposes other than accident prevention is inadequate and could lead to misinterpretation.
